In your e-mails

- If you have any doubts about or questions about an e-mail, forward it to your security team if you have one or if you don't have this resource and you know the sender, give them a call.

- 4. Don't agree to download the first module or plugins that come along in a pop-up windows; always use the publisher's website or contact your IT department if you need something.
